Unearthed near the mouth of Singapore River at Empress Place during an excavation in 1998. The Empress Place site dates back to the 14th century, which gives a guide as to when this statue was created.

HISTORICAL FACT:

This Javanese-style figurine and trade ceramics discovered at Empress Place could indicate that Temasek and the river played an important role in the region's maritime trade network even before 1819.
